Opinion

We have audited the financial statements of **HATHWAY CBN MULTINET PRIVATE LIMITED**, which comprise the balance sheet as at 31st March 2019, and the statement of Profit and Loss and statement of cash flows for the year then ended, and notes to the financial statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information.
